

Jaime Suchlicki is Emilio Bacardi Moreau Distinguished Professor and director of the Institute for Cuban and Cuban-American Studies at the University of Miami. He is the author of Cuba: From Columbus to Castro, now in its fifth edition; Mexico: From Montezuma to the Rise of the PAN, now in its third edition; and the recently published Breve Historia de Cuba.

Elizabeth Kath is a Research Fellow with the Global Cities Institute at RMIT University in Melbourne. Her work over the past seven years has focused on Cuba. This included a study of the social and political dimensions of Cuba's public health system, specifically its Maternal-Infant Health Program, for which she spent nine months conducting field research in Havana. Elizabeth's research on Cuba will be published in April 2010 as a book: *Social Relations and the Cuban Health Miracle*. In addition, she is the author of numerous works that have appeared in international journals including *Policy and Politics*, *Cuba in Transition*, and *Dialogue*.

Aside from her ongoing work on Cuba, she also co-authored the health components of the Global Cities Institute's recent '*Sustainable Communities, Sustainable Development*' report, which identifies alternative, community-engaged pathways to development in Papua New Guinea. Her more recent research interests relate to issues of reconciliation, particularly as they relate to health in various global contexts. She is Director of Communications for *Global Reconciliation*, an international network that seeks to promote human security through community engagement and local-global collaboration.

G.B. Hagelberg now residing in England, had a close view of Cuba's economy from 1960 to 1968 and from 1980 to 1986 was the resident sugar adviser of the government of Barbados. He is the author of numerous publications, including a book-length study, *The Caribbean Sugar Industries: Constraints and Opportunities* (1974).

José Alvarez is an Emeritus Professor at the University of Florida. He has conducted joint research with Cuban institutions since the late 1980s, when he made his first professional trip to Cuba. He is the author of *Cuba's Agricultural Sector* (UPF, 2004), and co-editor of *Reinventing the Cuban Sugar Agroindustry* (Lexington Books, 2005).
